Port Pire Regional Health Service, Hammill House has a Day lounge, Lounge and Dining areas, Library, Men's Shed, Craft Room, Courtyard gardens, BBQ area, front garden, and Chapel.

Services

Port Pire Regional Health Service, Hammill House provides Permanent Care and Ageing in Place.

Hammill House originally opened in 1975 as a 24 bed transportable seniors hostel unit and was established to accommodate carefully selected groups of residents. Day care, Activities and Industrial therapy also were established. Between 1976 and 1978 a 61-bed medical/geriatric block was established and officially opened by the then Hon D H Banfield, Minister for Health, on 19 January 1978.

It was named Hammill House honouring the hospital's medical superintendent Dr R D Hammill.

Hammill House underwent a major redevelopment between 2001 and 2011 and now boasts a beautiful spacious and comfortable living environment for 30 residents.

In addition to our comprehensive clinical care programs, we offer Healthy Ageing programs, Allied Health, Social Worker, Diversional Therapist, Oral Hygiene check-ups, Chaplain, Medicare, on-site access to GP, incontinence products & toiletries (subject to legislated scheduled service), entertainment, library, electrical appliance testing, postal service.

Meals are prepared and cooked onsite daily, complimented by a rotating menu.

Location/Access

Port Pire Regional Health Service, Hammill House is situated in the Southern Flinders area of South Australia in the regional city of Port Pirie. Port Pirie is a vibrant town located in an agricultural region. Hammill House is a single level Residential Aged Care Facility, offering a home-like atmosphere for singles and couples and features landscaped gardens and surrounds.

Leisure & Well-Being

Port Pire Regional Health Service, Hammill House caters for residents from diverse cultural backgrounds and our Leisure & Well-Being Program is designed to celebrate this diversity. Our adaptive and flexible program is also tailored to the needs of residents with dementia and other health issues.

Hammill House fosters and encourages residents to stay involved in the local community. Visiting organisations for social contact and support include Multi-denominational Services; Bedford Community Visitors; Lions Club and a variety of local entertainers. Hammill House also encourages residents to stay connected by supporting current activities outside of the home. The diverse activities program within Hammill House is led by a Diversional Therapist and Activities Officers and is also supported by a strong team of dedicated volunteers. We also offer transport bus/van, Beauty Therapy and Nails, Men's Shed, Craft integrated entertainment with day programs, Broadband for Seniors.
