There are onsite religious services monthly, to provide emotional and spiritual support to residents and their families.

Meals are prepared and cooked onsite daily and there is a rotating menu.

Co-located with the Hospital there is ready access to medical care.

Kara House is strongly supported by the local community and has strong links with the local community organisations, churches, and businesses. 24-hour support from a dedicated team of staff offering ageing in place.

Most of our staff live in the local area and have been with us for many years, ensuring continuity of care. The staff take pride in providing compassionate and professional care.

The town of Clare is in the Mid North region of South Australia, approx. 136 km north of Adelaide. It gives its name to the Clare Valley wine region, one of Australia's oldest wine regions.
