Limestone Coast Local Health Network (LCLHN) provide a range of residential care services across regional South Australia in Bordertown, Keith, Kingston, Millicent, Naracoorte and Penola.

We are part of SA Health and provide high quality services that aim to enrich the people's lives regardless of their health and support requirements, financial circumstances or lifestyle preferences.

Sheoak Lodge, Millicent has a team of highly dedicated professional individuals who are compassionate and caring. Staff members and volunteers play an integral role in the holistic care of our residents by providing support and companionship whilst encouraging independence where possible. We understand that maintaining a link between family, friends and the local community enriches the quality of life of our residents.

Our goal is to provide quality care that celebrates a sense of self, family and community.



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Services and Facilities

Sheoak Lodge is a 60-bed single story facility situated in a quiet residential area on Towers Road close to the town's shopping and recreational facilities. It provides both permanent and respite accommodation. It is co located on the grounds of the Millicent and District Hospital and Healthcare Service ensuring ready access to medical care.

In addition to the comprehensive clinical care programs Sheoak Lodge offer scheduled visits by a General Practitioner, Pharmacist, Physiotherapist and Podiatrist.

Resident's enjoy meals prepared and cooked onsite daily based on a rotating menu.

Common Areas

Our facility has an array of different common areas to enrich the daily lives of our residents. These areas provide areas of both tranquility and relaxation as well as stimulation and activity. Our aim is to offer a variety of harmonious spaces where the older person is able to relax alone or interact with each other, their guests and our staff.

All common areas are cosy, homelike and comfortable with a tasteful décor.

Residents are encouraged to join in activities, or they can simply sit in any of our areas, in comfortable chairs to talk, read or watch several large screen TVs throughout the service. They are also able to relax outdoors enjoying the gardens. Our common areas are all wheelchair accessible.

Leisure and Wellbeing

Residents can do as much or as little as they like. An extensive leisure and lifestyle program offers group and individually tailored activities. The service caters for residents from diverse cultural backgrounds and the leisure and lifestyle program is designed to celebrate this diversity. Our adaptive and flexible program is also tailored to the needs of residents with dementia and other health issues.

Residents are encouraged to maintain community links and are assisted to attend offsite meetings with groups such as Legacy, Lions and Rotary. The Sheoak van is used regularly for outings.

There are onsite religious services on a regular basis and a member of the local Churches visit regularly to provide emotional and spiritual support to residents and families.

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Residential Aged Care Fee Information

Introduction

Entering residential aged care for the first time can be an emotionally difficult period for you and your family. However, it is important you understand the cost implications of residential aged care.

The below information is designed to help you familiarise yourself with the various terms used and the fees and charges associated with residential aged care.

What a person pays in aged care is determined by Services Australia or Department of Veterans' Affairs following a means assessment. One or more of the fees as listed below may be applicable.

Our Aged Care Liaison Officer (ACLO) works with each prospective resident and / or their representative providing an estimate of the fees and accommodation charges.

Please note Limestone Coast Local Health Network is not a financial advisor and therefore unable to provide financial planning advice. It is recommended you speak to your own financial advisor / seek independent financial advice prior to admission to aged care.

A basic daily fee (standard fee) – all residents, including respite are required to pay a basic daily care fee as a contribution towards their care and living expenses. The daily care fee for all residents equates to 85% of the standard single Aged Pension and is updated twice a year in March and September.

Accommodation Payment – not all residents pay an accommodation payment or contribution, only those that have assets above the asset free threshold as detailed in the fee schedule.

Persons assessed as being liable for the full room cost or Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD) as set out by Limestone Coast Local Health Network (LCLHN) have three options for payment:

- i. Refundable Accommodation Deposit (RAD) a lump sum refundable payment; or
- ii. Daily Accommodation Payment (DAP) the daily equivalent you pay if you elect not to pay a RAD invoiced fortnightly; or
- iii. Combination a part RAD and part DAP. A combination example is noted on the fee schedule; however, a resident can choose the amount that suits their financial needs. The Aged Care Liaison Officer (ACLO) can assist in providing RAD/DAP payment scenarios.

Means Tested Care Fee (MTCF) - This is an additional contribution towards the cost of care and not all people that move into aged care will be required to pay it. The Government will advise of this fee, if applicable, following the means assessment. Annual and lifetime caps apply to means tested care fees.

Means Assessment - All prospective aged care residents require a means assessment by Services Australia. Based on their circumstances they will be required to submit either:

Residential Aged Care Property Details Form – SA485 – for persons on a pension and own their own home <u>https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/sa485</u>

OR

Residential Aged Care Calculation of you cost of Care SA457 form to Services Australia for non-pensioners. https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/sa457

For those on an aged pension with no home it is recommended you call Services Australia on 1800 227 475 and request a pre commencement fee letter.
